
## Department Update



## The Paper Shredder Event



The annual document shredding event was a great success yet again. The truck was filled and the sides were bulging. This event will return to Stony Creek Sports Park located at 500 North Wales Road in Blue Bell. On Saturday May 7th the Whitpain Police Association will be hosting their annual paper shredding event for residents of Whitpain Township. It will be begin at 9:00 am and will conclude at 1:00 pm or until the truck is filled.

Rapid Recycling, Inc will set up their on-site shredding truck and Whitpain Police Association members will be available to assist you with getting your sensitive documents shredded. Rapid Recycling, Inc is a bonded vendor that conforms to all HIPAA and GLB standards on the handling and processing of confidential documents for destruction. The on-site truck is only capable of shredding paperwork. Please bring any documents that you would like destroyed and make sure that they are free from rubber bands, binders, or anything else that could impede the shredding process.

#### Awards

Since or last publications, several Whitpain Police officers have been recognized for outstanding service in different areas of responsibility.

Officer Rippert conducted a traffic stop of two suspicious males. Through great investigation, Rippert was able to seize a gun, a mask and gloves from the vehicle. The two males were later determined to be suspects in multiple armed robberies throughout Montgomery and Bucks County.

Officers Wittig, Armstrong, Daly, Bleuit, Wilfong and Bealer all contributed to the investigation of a violent home invasion in the township. The actors in this case targeted an Asian business owner and his family. The result of the case sent several actors to State prison for a long time.

Officers Bleuit, Homan and Becker were crucial in assisting the Department of Homeland Security in the tracking of an airplane carrying a very large amount of narcotics into Montgomery County. The officers were able to stop the suspects and recover the large quantity of narcotics that were bound for distribution in the immediate area.

Officers McGuire, Beitler, Daly, Becker and Gallagher assisted the Montgomery Township Police Department in stopping and detaining the driver of a dump truck that had just robbed a local bank. The officers conducted a felony car stop on the large truck on a very busy stretch of road. The officers kept the public safe during this arrest and no one was injured.

#### Beware of Scams!

Don't let yourself become a victim! Recently the police department has seen a rise in several types of known phone scams. The perpetrators often target the elderly and use several different methods to try and get the victim to send money to them via MoneyGram, wire transfer, etc. One of these methods involves the suspect calling and portraying himself as law enforcement and telling the victim that their child or grandchild is in jail and that they must send money to them for the child to be released. Another method which is very common around tax season, is that the suspect will call and advise that he is with the IRS and tell the victim that they owe large sums of money. The caller then tells them to send a few thousand dollars now to satisfy their debt. Neither law enforcement nor the IRS would ever call your house and ask for money! There are some warning signs to be aware of so you can pick out the scams. The phone number the person is calling from is usually an area code you do not recognize because it is not local and the person will often have an accent, as these scams are often attempted by persons out of the country.

#### Steps to follow if you receive a phone call like this:

- DO NOT give any of your personal information!
- Hang up the phone immediately. If they left you a voice message, do not return the call.
- If you did not provide any of your information and you did not suffer any financial loss from a scam, you do not have to file a report but you can notify the police department for documentation purposes and you can also report it to the below agencies.
- If your personal information has been compromised and/ or you did suffer a financial loss as a result, you should file a police report and also report the scam to the links listed below.
- IRS impersonation scam report to the Treasury Inspector General Tax Administration (TIGTA) @ www.treasury. gov/tigta/contact\_report\_scam.shtml
- Victims should also report to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) via their online complaint form @ www. ftccomplaintassistant.gov and also email to phishing@irs. gov (subject: "IRS phone scam")
